Pointing this out to the elders he talked about how much money we spent on medicine, that their children were going to receive for free. Although I didn't understand him, he spoke for some time. After speaking one of the elders said, "okay, where do you want to set up for the medical outreach?" Praise the Lord. I am not willing to compromise the message of the gospel to suit our hosts, but I am also very interested in being able to maintain relationship at least long enough to complete the work the Holy Spirit has for us there.
